OUR WORK

Since 2015, the Foundation has raised over \$4.2 million for 60x30TX. This investment has helped to support programs like:

Advise TX (Outreach & Engagement): The Advise TX program places 'near-peer' advisers in high-risk Texas high schools with the mission of building a college-going culture at that school and helping students find the best fit for their college and career goals.

The Grad TX Consortium (Student Success): The Grad TX Consortium is a group of dedicated innovators who are working with the Coordinating Board to investigate and implement strategies that will re-engage individuals who have some college but no degree and help them get back on the path to degree completion.

Developmental Education - Experimental Pathways Research (Policy & Research): The Coordinating Board collaborated with

American Institutes for Research (AIR) and the RAND Corporation to study Texas' recent policy changes to move students more efficiently through developmental education courses into credit-bearing courses.

The Foundation is privileged to support these as well as other high priority projects of the Coordinating Board. Working together - alongside ISDs, postsecondary institutions, businesses, foundations, government agencies, and other nonprofits – the Foundation's Trustees and staff envision a future in which Texas has achieved the bold goals of 60x30TX and helped to secure a prosperous future for all Texans.
